II. Upper Division.....6

The candidate courses for the GEP will be submitted to the GEP committee by the presepective department and colleges. The specific courses within this group to be taken by the student will then be designated by the individual departments and colleges. The selection of the Upper Division Package for each major must be outside that specific major.

All selections of the departments and colleges concerning their preferences for the option courses, are to be submitted to the GEP university-wide committee. The rationale for the selection of those specific courses for a particular major discipline should be stated.
