**2. Summary of Meetings**

The Library Advisory Committee met twice in the John C. Hitt Library, room 511, during the 2016-17 academic year; once in the Fall 2016 semester (October 24, 2016) and once in the Spring semester (on April 10, 2017). Each meeting lasted approximately 1 hour (refer to Library Advisory Committee minutes for details of time, date, and location).

**3. Summary of Issues and/or Topics Addressed**

Topics discussed during meeting included (see committee minutes for more information)

- 21<sup>st</sup> Century Library Project updates (automatic retrieval center, 4<sup>th</sup> floor reading room, 3-phase construction, interim construction, new entry and connector building, other building renovations to restrooms, elevators, sprinklers, stairwells, 5<sup>th</sup> floor quiet study)
- Downtown Campus Academic Building will have library space with about 12K volumes and a “floating collection” to access books as needed
- STARS (Showcase of Text, Archives, Research & Scholarship) – successful institutional repository for faculty, staff, students, and UCF affiliates to share work globally in place
- Digital Studio: 70” monitors and editing bay tentatively set for installment Spring 2017
- Textbook Affordability –based on national/state legislation to improve textbook affordability for students with online solutions; promoted program to be faculty-driven
- Library Security – Community Security Officer evening presence (Sun – Thur); plans for surveillance cameras and possibly card swipe access under consideration
- Library Materials Budget 2016-17 is sound. Concerns expressed regarding negotiations with several publishers limiting access to databases/journals more than 20 years old
- New Integrated Library System (ILS)- Implementation under Florida Academic Library Services Cooperative delayed until 2018 to allow time for desired features
- Funded Tech Fee Proposals – six Libraries Student Tech Fee Proposals were funded

**4. Recommendations/Outcomes**

Committee members asked questions and discussed the topics listed in #3 (see committee minute for further information). Committee did not draft, nor vote on, any resolutions.
