The following report is submitted in accordance with the Faculty Senate rules.

The Admissions and Standards Committee is a Joint Committee of Faculty Senate. Its membership includes faculty, non-faculty and student representatives from several academic colleges, the Division of Student Development and Enrollment Services, Undergraduate Studies, Student Government Association and Graduate Student Association.

The committee consists of six faculty members, three of whom are graduate faculty, selected by the Committee on Committees (in consultation with the vice president for Student Development and Enrollment Services), one undergraduate student nominated by the president of the Student Government, one graduate student nominated by the president of the Graduate Student Association (in consultation with vice provost and dean of the College of Graduate Studies), and six members from the professional staff selected by the vice president for Student Development and Enrollment Services.

## **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- 1. To consider all undergraduate student admissions that do not meet the minimum university admissions standards and that are referred to it by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.
- 2. To consider all undergraduate student appeals of readmission decisions or academic standing.
- 3. To consider undergraduate student appeals of decisions that have been made by the College of Undergraduate Studies concerning late withdrawals, late drops, late adds, and medical withdrawals.
- 4. To consider graduate student appeals of decisions that have been made by the College of Graduate Studies concerning late withdrawals, late drops, late adds, and medical withdrawals.

### **Report of Activity:**

For the 2018-2019 academic year, starting on May 15, 2018 and ending on April 30, 2019, the Admissions and Standards committee heard **217 cases** (12.4% increase; 193 cases in 2017-2018).
