The Faculty Senate at UCF:

The primary role of the Faculty Senate at UCF is to promote faculty participation in the governance of the University. To achieve this goal, the Senate must serve as a forum for discussions, recommendations, suggestions, and voicing concerns on all matters affecting the primary missions of the University. Further, the Senate must serve as one of the conduits for two way communication between the faculty and the university administration. The revised constitution of the Faculty Senate, in my judgement, is a major milestone in enhancing significantly the potential for faculty governance. Of course, this also places additional responsibility on faculty to devote time and effort and participate in the process.

Bio-sketch

Dr. Yasser A. Hosni is a professor in the department of Industrial Engineering and Management System (IEMS) at UCF. He holds a B.Sc. in mechanical engineering (1963), M.Sc. in Production engineering (1967), both from Cairo university, Ph.D. in Industrial engineering from university of Arkansas (1976). He worked in Industry from 1963 to 1973 before obtaining his Ph.D. and joining UCF in 1976.

Teaching activities include over 15 different courses in undergraduate and graduate levels, supervising over 25 M.Sc. thesis and 4 Ph.D. students.

Research activities include conducting over 20 funded research projects totalling around \$1.25M, publishing and presenting over 90 articles in refereed journals, books, proceedings, and conferences.

Have been in 5 university committees including University personnel committee, academic and standards, graduate council and several search committees for chairs, asst./ assoc. and dean. Have been in 7 college committees including personnel and research committees, and all IEMS dept'l committees. Three terms in the UCF senate (several senate committees including the steering committee).

Recent awards include dept. researcher of the year (1990, 1991), teacher of the year (1992), nominated as a distinguished professor of engineering (1993), Tau Beta Pi College of engineering teacher of the year (1993).

He is a reviewer for a number of professional journals and the associated editor of the International Journal "Computers and Industrial Engineering". Active member in a number of professional societies including IIE, IEEE, SME, and ASEE. Past president of the IIE chapter of Central Florida.

Views With respect to the UCF senate:

The senate primary function is to cooperate with the administration in advancing the quality of education at UCF. Elected senators should reflect the views of their respective faculty. Issues which relate to the faculty grievances that affect the quality of education should be voiced and acted upon by the senate.

Over the short range, the following are among the issues which should be addressed:

1. It is believed that there is a morale problem among the faculty and staff at UCF which is bound to have an effect on the quality of education at UCF. The faculty senate should cooperate with the administration in resolving this issue.

2. Follow up with senate passed resolutions: Previously addressed, passed and adopted resolutions by the senate seem that they can be forgotten from year to year. The senate should formulate a committee with the purpose of periodically visiting and devising mechanisms for enforcing passed resolutions.
