Hepner turned the meeting over to Elizabeth Dooley, Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs, for remarks on the Collective Impact Strategic Plan. Lisa Jones, Associate Provost for Strategy and Professor, provided the council with an update on the Strategic Plan and highlighted a template for department/program use. Jones asked the council to encourage their faculty and administrators to use the metrics and templates in their own areas. Following the presentation on the faculty's role in including these metrics, a presentation was given based on one of the focused metrics: 4-year graduation rates and faculty-driven efforts to help move the needle. Linda Walters, Director of Center for Success of Women Faculty and Pegasus Professor in Biology, Kim Schneider, Assistant Dean of Academic Engagement and Director of Office of Undergraduate Research, and Mary Tripp, Adjunct in Writing and Rhetoric presented the use of High Impact Practices (HIP) Coaches in the classroom, specifically within the spring 2019 BSC 3312 Principles of Marine Biology course. Electronic versions of the meeting documents were distributed to share with faculty and staff in their respective units.

Hepner informed the committee that she is stepping down as chair and a new chair will be appointed for the upcoming academic year. She encouraged committee members to reach out to her or Lisa Jones if they were interested in the position.
