### Updates

- Downtown Campus Library – Rachel Mulvihill, Department Head, Downtown Library
  - Brief presentation with graphics and photos of main Creative Commons building and Library space: <https://goo.gl/EcFyCr>
- 21<sup>st</sup> Century Library Project – Barry Baker, Director of Libraries
  - Phase IA, connector building moving along; to be finished Fall 2019. Currently choosing furniture for about 1K new seats
  - Also planning Phase IIA renovation of existing John C. Hitt Library floors
  - Have completed Phase IA ingestion into ARC; those books are accessible at this time
- STARS – Selma Jaskowski, Associate Director, Technology Services & Resource Management
  - Over 1.6 million downloads from STARS so far
  - Attached: Flyer for faculty with available Library services
- Textbook Affordability – Penny Beile
  - \$1.33 million in savings so far; \$700 million in Library savings
  - Higher-level courses, books that might already be in a collection, are more likely to be available for e-book purchase. This 1-1 replacement allows faculty to not have to change their syllabi
  - Also have a print text reserve, sourced from donations, SGA, etc. Cannot accept course review books
  - Advocating for open materials; CDL can help embed a book into LMS
  - CDL trying to identify all courses with books totaling < \$60. The bookstore also has a program to allow students to purchase while waiting on their financial aid
- Draft Library Services brochure to create targeted presentations

### Questions

- How can faculty find out if their textbooks are offered as e-books? Contact your subject Librarian. Library's budget is geared towards research resource dollars, but there are options. Also working to increase visibility
- Faculty using e-book: Sends out information with e-textbooks prior to class, including all links; also in syllabi. Still required to submit book order to bookstore
