Terry Wheeler brought up a concern with the misuse/abuse of the vendor permits that are purchased by some campus departments. There is a particular department that seems to be a major abuser. We will address the vendor permits with updates to the parking regulations.

There was discussion to prohibit overnight parking on the first level of all of the unreserved garages. The general consensus is that we should not restrict overnight parking except in those garages that are already affected with no overnight parking.
