The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m.

The minutes from January 11, 2018 were approved.

There was not a quorum of voting members for the February meeting; therefore, no items were approved and no minutes to be approved.

New Business

- II-A. Request for two dedicated spaces for Psychology for human research on aging cognition – There was a move and second to approve two reserved spaces to be used for research at no cost. The request was unanimously approved.
- II-B: Departmental Daily permits – Parking Services is requesting an increase from \$1 to \$3 each in the daily permit fee charged to departments who purchase the scratch off permits, due to increased usage as well as misuse by some departments. There was a move and second to approve the increase as requested. The request was unanimously approved.
- II-C: Citation payments – Exploration of the possibility of providing a payment plan/community service opportunity for students who are on hold for unpaid parking citations. This item is under review; however, is not supportable at this time.
- II-D: Review of the 2018-19 parking regulations – Changes to the 2018-19 parking regulations were approved.

Old Business

III-A: Requests for Reserved Spaces

1. Tina Maier, Associate Director University Audit – This request was unanimously approved.

III-B: Discussion for charging at the EV charging stations. Effective with the 2018-19 regulations, there will be a \$1.00 per hour charge to use the EV charging station for a 4 hour maximum time limit. Charges will increase incrementally after the 4 hour period. This request was unanimously approved.

III-C: Proposal to provide, at no cost, twelve (12) 24-hour reserved parking spaces for each of the twelve (12) colleges to be earmarked for guest speakers, donors and other visitors to the colleges. Discussions are ongoing at this time.

III-D: Expectant mother spaces: Currently we have 29 active spaces.

Notes: It is recommended that talking points be developed as to how consideration is given toward requests for 24-hour reserved spaces.
