Introduction/Approval of Minutes

• Richard Hartshorne called the meeting to order. March meeting minutes were approved.

UCFApps Demonstration (Craig Froehlich)

- Craig Froelich led a demonstration of UCFApps. The demonstration included information/elements, such as:
 - Current list of apps
 - Methods of accessing apps
 - Requesting an app
 - Providing feedback
 - Marketing toolkit
 - o Presentation view
 - o Twitter feed
 - Ways to find/keep up with information about UCF Apps
- An introductory video was shown
- UCF Apps are tech-fee funded
- UCF Apps are linked from myUCF, Webcourses, CAR site, the mobile app, and apps.ucf.edu

Emergency Notification System Demonstration (Jeff Morgan)

- Jeff Morgan and Joe Thalheimer demonstrated the Emergency Notification system
- A new system is coming in the near future, currently being evaluated.
- The role of the Office of Security and Emergency Management was discussed (separate from PD).
- Clery Compliance (emergency notification, timely warnings) was discussed.
- UCFAlert, internal notification methods (remote lines, microphone capabilities), external notification methods (sirens, electronic signs, mobile units), incident action plan development, and documentation were addressed.
- A brief overview of the process for disseminating emergency notifications was provided.
- A discussion regarding the lack of the ability to personalize the notification settings for end users was discussed as a potential issue. Being considered, but drawbacks to this.

Discussion of Mechanics to Disseminate Important Information Regarding Various Technological Changes Across Campus (Joel Hartman)

- Joel Hartman led a discussion.
- There are number of university committees that meet regarding technological issues (ITRCC, ITRAC, etc.) and are charged with relaying information to their user base (individual colleges and departments).
- There is a paper-based ITR newsletter that is disseminated campus-wide on a quarterly basis.
- E-mail is used to disseminate critical information .
- There is currently an examination of a social tool (Yammer) which may be used to disseminate information in the future.
- CDL publishes a newsletter and posts updates/changes to Canvas on a regular basis.
