The minutes from the meeting of September 8, 2016 were approved.

New Business

- II-A: Decal fees/salary range – a proposal is under consideration to amend the salary requirements for permit purchase. Employees with salaries greater than \$50,000 will still be required to purchase a “B” permit. Employees with salaries less than \$50,000 will have the option to purchase a “B” or “C” permit. Tabled for further discussion.
- II-B: Chandra Kethi-Reddy - Proposing a pilot program for carpooling to encourage those who already carpool by having a parking space available. The proposal is that 10 carpool spaces be allocated in each parking garage which would not be enforced by Parking Services but be controlled by SGA and that SGA would be allowed to install the necessary signs.
Discussion from the Committee: Recommend that the proposers look at other universities, specifically University of Florida. It is also recommended that the proposers take a quantitative sample and present sample of signs to be installed. Tabled for further discussion.

Old Business

- III-A: Health Center Spaces / Lifting time restrictions. There will be no change to the time restrictions. These spaces are used after hours for various groups such as therapy sessions. Additionally, the spaces need to be preserved in the event of a campus emergency for mobilization of critical/essential staff.
- III-B: Requests for Reserved Spaces:
1. Rudy McDaniel, Assistant Dean, College of Arts and Humanities
This request was unanimously approved.
- III-B: Expectant Mother parking spaces review
Currently there are 15 spaces in use

Discussion: The downtown garage is under consideration to be built by fall of 2018. There is also discussion underway to build a temporary parking lot south of parking garage C which

will accommodate 200-300 vehicles. Once this lot is open, the Park 'N Ride lot will be closed.
