A question arose regarding Spring commencement, 2000. It has been determined that Spring commencement will be held on a Friday evening and all day Saturday.

Dr. Cook reminded the faculty that two workshops on TIP will be conducted by Provost Gary Whitehouse next week.

NEW BUSINESS Committee Reports

Budget and Administrative - No report

<u>Graduate Council</u> - Dr. Jamal Nayfeh reported that the next meeting will be held on October 21, 1999. Presently they are discussing the issues of full-time status for graduate students and course action requests.

<u>Undergraduate Policy and Curriculum Committee</u> - Dr. Karl-Heinrich Barsch reported that the Committee met on October 5, 1999. The College of Business Administration submitted two proposals: 1) to add an International Business Track to each major with the college, eventually leading to a BA in International Business, and 2) to follow the lead of the College of Arts and Sciences in changing the current policy for change of majors. When a change of major occurs, the student must use the current catalog in effect at the time of the change. The two proposals were unanimously approved by the UPCC. There was a consensus that this policy should be university-wide. It will be discussed further at the November meeting.

The proposal from the Department of Mathematics on the NC grades is also on the agenda for the November meeting. The Departments of English and Statistics are using NC grades at this time, and the department Chairs have been invited to attend to give their insights on the process.

<u>Personnel Committee</u> - Dr. Mike Mullens reported that six topics were discussed, five were accepted to move to the next level. Five teams will address the following issues:

- 1. Deans involvement in third year promotion review.
- 2. Appointment of spouses
- 3. Parking privileges for faculty from area campuses and campus faculty
- 4. Insurance and benefits
- 5. Role in research and teaching in tenure earning positions.

Dr. Cook stated that at this time there are no resolutions to discuss, no presentations, and no formal business that needs action at the October 28th Senate meeting. A motion was moved and seconded to cancel the October 28, 1999 Faculty Senate meeting. The motion was unanimously approved. Dr. Cook encouraged the committees to continue with their assignments. All Senators are encouraged to attend the November 1, 1999 Faculty Assembly.


