

Faculty Senate Parking Advisory Committee
Meeting of the meeting - 9-10-15

Agenda Items

1. Committee addressed the first agenda item of assigning two members of the committee to serve as volunteers on the "committee title." Kimberly Jentsch had previously volunteered to serve, and Donna Frazee volunteered to serve as the second member of this committee.
2. The committee addressed an issue raised by the Dean of the Rosen College regarding parking arrangements for Rosen faculty on the main campus, particularly when they are travelling to the main campus for committee assignments. According to committee member Manuel Rivera, faculty from Rosen were under the impression that they had to pay \$5 per day to park on main campus. Kris Singh outlined options that the Rosen College would have to address this situation, including the purchase of hang tags that could be shared, and the bulk purchase of day parking passes, available to the Rosen College at a cost of \$1 per day. The availability of \$1 per day passes appeared to solve this situation, and it was agreed that Kris Singh would contact the Dean of the Rosen College to resolve this situation. As a mechanism is already in place to solve this issue, no further committee action was required.
3. The Advisory Committee addressed the question of when it will next meet. It was agreed that the next meeting would take place on an ad hoc basis, with a status update meeting taking place no later than the end of November. Donna Frazee agreed to send a scheduling request for a mid-November meeting to committee members.
4. Miscellaneous business. The first item of miscellaneous business was raised by Ella Bossy-Wetzel concerning visitor parking at the College of Medicine in Lake Nona. Kris Singh addressed the options available to the College and its visitors. The discussion seemed to indicate that reasonable options for visitor parking were available (the College can purchase day passes at the bulk price of \$1 per day to distribute to its visitors), but that there was an unclear understanding of these options. It was agreed that Kris Singh would assure that proper signage was present at the College of Medicine, and that follow-up communication between the College and Parking and Transportation Services would be initiated. The second item of miscellaneous business concerned questions of safety in parking structures on campus. Kris Singh and Curtis Sawyer addressed the current initiatives regarding security cameras, license plate recognition technology, and other security efforts.
5. The meeting was adjourned.
