The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m.

The minutes of August 9 were approved.

New Business

- II-A. Bill Martin – Campus Master Plan Initiatives: Mr. Bill Martin, Director of Facilities Planning gave an overview of projects that have been completed or are in process. During the past four years, 808 minor projects have been completed; 617 other substantial projects worked on with 196 of those completed. There can be as many as 350 projects of one type or another ongoing at any given time.

A partial list of completed projects include: A re-roof of the engineering building; boiler replacements; a much needed renovation of the reflecting pond; the Research 1 Building which received a project management award; Facility and Safety surplus room; renovation of the Provost's suite in Millican Hall; Engineering HVAC; baseball facility upgrade; UCF's 4th district energy plant with efficient chillers; Trevor Colbourn Hall Building with over 135,000 SF of space

Some items in progress include: the CREOL Building expansion is ongoing; the Roth Athletic Center is in design; Garvey Center for student athlete nutrition; the Student Union expansion and renovation of the food court; Partnership IV and V are planned; the Hotel and Conference Center; John C. Hitt Library which is being built in stages

UCF Downtown: UCF is taking the lead on the renovation for the Center for Emerging Media; Central Energy plant; downtown parking garage, UCF/Valencia Union West @ Creative Village

Health Sciences Center: College of Nursing and Health Sciences building along with a parking garage – currently awaiting approvals

Rosen College: Rosen Education Facility and discussions for a parking garage

Consideration is being given to a research area or a potential business park area along Aria Drive

- II-B: Rosen Issue – weekly meetings for off campus persons. The group has disbanded and presently this is no longer an issue
- II-C: Free motorcycle permit with purchase of a car/truck parking permit: Members of the Knight Riders motorcycle group are requesting that those who purchase a car/truck permit and have a motorcycle to register, be given the motorcycle permit for free or be given permission to purchase a hang tag and use on both the car/truck and motorcycle as needed. This item to be moved to Old Business for further consideration
- II-D: Lime Bike Management – complaints from campus constituents that the Lime Bikes are being left along sidewalks, in buildings and other places that creates a safety issue. It was recommended that complaints be forwarded to Dave Norvell given that this is a sustainability issue. The user needs to be held accountable, as well as having designated zones for return of the bicycles
- II-E: Weekly shuttle to WalMart Market Place – there is consideration to have a shuttle transport on-campus resident students to the WalMart Market Place on Alafaya Trail, beginning with the spring semester 2019.
- II-F: Meeting Schedule for 2018-19 – the meeting time will remain at 9:00 a.m. on the second Thursday of each month for the fall semester; however, the schedule will be re-addressed in November for the spring semester.
