Meeting called to order at 11:32 a.m.

Vote on approval of minutes from October 22, 2018 meeting. **Minutes approved.**

Old Business.

● **Golf Cart Speed Limits -- Christina Serra, Director of Compliance and Ethics**

- Recent transition regarding which office has jurisdiction over Golf Cart usage/policy
- No current policy on speed limits; overall policy will need to be drafted and passed through regular approval process, including approval by Policy Committee, and posting for comment. Unsure where current 15 mph limit came from.
- Committee expressed interest in slower limit, e.g., 10 mph
- All University members can subscribe to policy notifications
- Training is already mandatory
- Usage guide posted on Compliance and Ethics website, include which sidewalks can be used
- Every cart is numbered and can be reported for follow-up; not obvious how pedestrians know where to report. Committee endorsed mandatory bumper stickers with a reporting phone number
- Any vehicle without a license tag is subject to golf-cart rules (for example, landscaping carts)

New Business. None

Other Business. Rich Goss reported that he still moves some Lime Bikes out of inappropriate places (in parking spaces, at curb cuts, in front of door actuators, in walkways, etc.)
